

Where it All Began...

1964—A group of concerned parents and interested citizens established an Association to help children with developmental disabilities

1965—Bonnechere Valley School opened at Bonnechere Manor operated by the Association

1969- Renfrew County Board of Education assumed responsibility for Bonnechere Valley School

1977— Adult Group Residence opened at 874 Raglan Street

1984— Supported Independent Living Program implemented

1987— Life Skills Program implemented. Association incorporated under the name Community Living Renfrew & District. First Executive Director hired; Peter Thompson

1989—25th Anniversary Celebration

1993-First Annual Laurel Rafuse Memorial Golf Tournament

1996— Assumed responsibility for Day Supports in Arnprior. Name changed to Community Living Renfrew County South

2000- Respite apartment established in Arnprior

2001— First Annual M. Sullivan & Son Golf Tournament in support of children's summer programs

2001-New Executive Director, Sue Beaudry

2004— CLRCS celebrated 40 years of Supports & Services. Self-Advocates Committee was established

2004—1st Walk, Wheel or Run was held, the name later changed to The Unity Run

2006—Group home gifted to CLRCS in Renfrew. First Group home opened in Arnprior

2007—Condominiums in Arnprior purchased. Jennifer Creeden is the new Executive Director

2008—Second Group Home opened in Amprior

2009—Community Living Associations across Ontario marked the closing of the institutions at the end of March 2009. The new Multi-Sensory Room opened in Arnprior. New home opened in July in Arnprior

2011—The Arnprior Community Access Supports moved to 106 McGonigal St. The residents of Opeongo moved to Coumbes Lane



#5toSurvive Campaign

Did you know the Developmental Services sector has not seen an increase to their base budgets since 2009 and only received a 3.4% increase in 30 years? Community Living Ontario began a movement to urge all local MPPs, Minister Parsa (MCCSS) and Premier Ford to increase the DS sector funding by 5% including Passport & Special Services at Home. This would help stabilize local support organizations, and vital community-based services that would otherwise be lost.

Renfrew County had the 2nd highest amount of signed petitions in Ontario to MPP Yakabuski, Minister Parsa and Premier Doug Ford. We thank everyone who participated. Our campaign is not over and we will continue to advocate for this much needed funding!

2024 Inclusion Symposium:

On March 19-20 in Toronto, I had the opportunity to attend the Inclusion Symposium.

The conference consisted of several keynote speakers, panel discussions and some smaller group work.

The topics and discussions were about the benefits of an inclusive community, the vital role natural connections play and recognize everyone's strengths and abilities. For People (with Developmental Disabilities) to not merely exist in the community, but to flourish as contributing members, and allowing people to live the lives they choose!

We learned about the importance of Equity Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) in the Developmental sector and the complex issues of racial trauma, stigma and shame that people who are black, self-identified black, and African Caribbean (and have a developmental disability) face daily.

Being away at a conference and being surrounded with other like-mind people allowed for some good conversations, idea sharing and networking to occur. I had the chance to chat with a variety of people from all over Ontario. These chats, guest speakers, and group work were enlightening and gave me a chance to reflect on what I am currently doing, and how I can improve not only in my daily job, but in life!





Icepicker's Sledge Hockey Celebrates 20 years!

The Icepickers are a huge part of Community Living's effort to promote inclusion over the past 20 years. The first four sledges were handcrafted using pipes bent with the help of a volunteers Ford F-150 and skate blades purchased from the Salvation Army.

Allan Yull was a major part of the Icepicker's advocacy for a number of accessibility features added to the myFM Centre's recently added second ice pad, such as clear boards along the benches and accessible dressing rooms.

Among the participants in the celebration included Chadd Stoppa! He's an up and coming sledge hockey (Para Hockey) player from Barry's Bay. Chadd is a bronze medalist in Para Hockey from the 2023 Ontario Winter Games. Chadd has been fortunate to attend a NextGen, Para Hockey development camp for Team Canada. We will likely see him representing Team Canada in the future!
